



3 Strike Rule and Procedures for Team COVID Monitors



Team COVID Monitor

- ▶ Each team will identify a Team COVID Monitor
 - A parent (preferred), an Assist Coach (acceptable), a Head Coach (avoid)
 - ▶ That person's job is to remind spectators follow COVID protocols
 - ▶ The 3 Strike Rule is intended to give the Monitor some recourse if a spectator does not comply
 - ▶ We do not want confrontation, scary situations or aggressive behavior by either the Monitor or the Spectator
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Why and How?

- ▶ In an effort to give some weight to the request to comply with the transmission prevention protocols and rules modifications of each sport, if a spectator is asked to comply with a COVID protocol, and they do not respond, they will be subject to the following:
 - First strike is a warning
 - Second strike is a week suspension for the family (including all players participating)
 - Third Strike is the removal of the family from the season, no refund. There will be no appeals, and no discussion.
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Why and How?

- ▶ The Team COVID Monitor will notify the coach and the Program COVID Officer (Ross)
 - ▶ Ross will reach out to the offending party informing them that they have been documented and remind them of the protocols. He will also remind them of what happens at subsequent strikes.
 - ▶ If the offending party complies at any point, either first, second or third strike, no write up is needed.
 - ▶ The documentation is only when there is any pushback or argument.
 - ▶ Team COVID Officer doesn't need to force the spectator to do anything at the time which might escalate a situation. This allows for future follow up and gives everyone time to reflect on the encounter.
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
